Why was Jonah written?

The call of God and the rebellion of people [vss. 1-3]

“Get up! **Go to the great city of Nineveh** and preach against it because their evil has come up before me.”

Jonah got up to flee to Tarshish from the Lord's presence.

You can run, but you cannot hide. [vss. 4-6]

But the Lord threw a great wind onto the sea, and such a great storm arose on the sea that the ship threatened to break apart.

When your testimony says one thing and your life says another.

I'm a Hebrew. **I worship the Lord**, the God of the heavens, who made the sea and the dry land.”

Would you rather die than repent? [vss. 10-12]

“Pick me up and **throw me into the sea...**”

Do you fear the Lord more than you fear people? [vss. 13-16]
